UKHAHLAMBA DRAKENSBERG PARK, THE SOUTH AFRICAN COMPONENT OF THE MALOTI- DRAKENSBERG PARK WORLD HERITAGE SITE INTEGRATED MANAGEMENT PLAN (IMP) REVISION

Ezemvelo KwaZulu-Natal Wildlife (Ezemvelo) is the designated Management Authority for the uKhahlamba Drakensberg Park, the South African component of the Maloti-Drakensberg Park World Heritage Site, and is responsible for the revision of the existing Integrated Management Plan for the Park in accordance with the World Heritage Convention Act, No 49 of 1999, National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, No 57 of 2003 and other relevant biodiversity and cultural heritage legislation.

The existing Integrated Management Plan (an overarching management framework for the Park which includes a zonation plan) was reviewed with the assistance of stakeholders through a public consultation process in 2018.

To facilitate further public input in the finalisation of this plan, stakeholders are invited to review the draft plan and provide written comment on the content thereof. The draft plan will be available for public viewing at the following locations:
